Len achieved a battlefield commission to the rank of Lieutenant before being discharged. He moved to Portsmouth in 1978, retiring from the Norfolk Naval Shipyard. Len was an active Mason, serving as Worshipful Master, DDGM as well many leadership roles in other Masonic organizations. He was an active member and Sunday school teacher at Broad Street Methodist Church in Portsmouth. Len was a superior leader and friend to all who knew him. As well as a great and beloved Brother and Mentor to those who knew him as the "Carpetbagger".

He was predeceased by a son, David and he leaves behind his children James Fredette, Leonard Fredette, Edwin Fredette, Laurie King, Debbie Hillard, Calvin Fredette, Mark Fredette, Matt Fredette, and Martin Mathers; nineteen grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren.
