AKIVA MIZRAHI DRORI, 74, passed peacefully on Feb. 10, 2011. Became a Longshoreman for the ILA Local 1624 in 1971, in 1977 purchased Jerry's Ship Store and ran the store while continuing to work as a Longshoreman, as well. He sold the store in the late 1980's and retired from his job as a Longshoreman in 1994 and remarried in 1997.

Akiva spoke 10 languages and loved to travel to foreign countries. Hobbies were cooking, dancing. He was an avid fan of old/classic films, new films, opera, classical orchestra, jazz, modern and international music. He also volunteered at the Harrison Opera House. Akiva was a very spiritual man that was a member of Beth El Temple and Kingdom Hall/VA Beach Pritchard Rd.
