Alton Frank Catlett - Affectionately known as "Skipper," passed away peacefully at home on Saturday, April 18th at the age of 94. He was born in Henderson, North Carolina, one of seven children of the late C. Samuel and Annie Catlett. He outlived all of his siblings, Robert, Harry, Esther, Cleland, Harriet and Addie.

A kind and tirelessly industrious man, Alton graduated from Henderson High School and served in the Navy from 1942-1946, during World War II. He worked for 33 years at Norfolk Naval Shipyard, retiring honorably as a Supervisory Electronics Technician. With his own hands, he built a home for his family on the banks of the Elizabeth River. He also was a local builder and real estate developer of numerous apartments and houses in the Portsmouth area. He served as President of the Ambassador Club of Portsmouth from 1968-1969, receiving a 50-year service award in 2004. He was a member of Portsmouth #100 and was also honored as a 50-year member of the Masonic Fraternity. He was a member of Port Norfolk Baptist Church.

Alton is survived by his loving wife of 72 years, Mildred Ellis Catlett; daughter, Nancy Catlett Mayo and her husband, A.T. of Portsmouth; son, Alton Frank Catlett, Jr. and his wife Laurie, of Williamsburg; grandson, Taylor Mayo and wife Michele; granddaughter Ellen Mayo Brady and husband Jon; granddaughter Jessica Catlett Mauder and husband Chris; granddaughters

Ashley Lynn Catlett, Lindsey Ann Catlett, and Annie Eliza Catlett; and five great-grandchildren.
