Andrew Boydston Johnson, Jr. "Boots", 84, went to be with the Lord on Tuesday December 19, 2007. Boots was a native of Portsmouth, a member of Churchland Baptist Church, a graduate of Woodrow Wilson High School, Norfolk Naval Shipyard Apprentice School, University of Richmond where he received his Bachelor in Arts, Southern Baptist Theological Seminary where he received his Master of Theology, Bowman Gray School of Medicine where he received his certificate in Pastoral Counseling, and attended James Madison University. Over the years he was affiliated with Southside Baptist Church in Chesterfield Co., VA, Lovingston Field of Churches in Nelson, Co, Shenandoah Baptist Church in Shenandoah, VA and Linden Heights Baptist Church in Staunton, VA.
