Bernard John Leary BJ, 84, of Greenfield Drive, Monday, Nov. 21, 2011, at his home in Portsmouth, VA.

Born in Burlington, VT, he was the son of Elizabeth and Patrick Leary, the sixth of ten children. He grew up in Burlington, attending Cathedral Grade School and Cathedral High School. He was an extremely faithful altar boy in the Catholic Church throughout his very young years, in all kinds of VT weather, particularly serving early Masses at Mount Saint Mary's Convent. He also worked very hard as a young boy at many odd jobs, especially caddying on the golf course and shoveling snow, in order to help support his younger brothers and sisters during the Great Depression.

BJ left school to join the Navy during World War II and retired as Chief Petty after 25 years of military service, having served on various Naval Bases, especially Norfolk VA. He was proud of his service in the Sixth Fleet on ships such as the USS Forrestal, especially in the Mideast.

Following his Navy retirement, he worked for Associated Naval Architects. In his spare time he refereed many basketball games in the Portsmouth area and enjoyed golf. Until ill health curtailed his activities, he also enjoyed meeting fellow veterans at Bingo gatherings, traveling with his wife and children on cruises, and general visiting with various family members, for whom he was always a most kind and generous father, grandfather, grandfather, uncle, brother-in-law and brother.
