



Bishop Charles Vache

November 1, 2009

The Rt. Rev. Claude Charles Vaché died November 1, 2009. Born August 4, 1926, in New Bern, North Carolina, Bishop Vaché was the son of the Reverend Jean Andrew Vaché and Edith Fitzwilson Vaché .

Bishop Vaché served in the U.S. Navy during the closing years of World War II and later received his bachelor's degree with honors from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa.

He attended Seabury-Western Theological Seminary from the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Virginia, earning his M. Div. degree cum laude, and began ordained ministry on June 11, 1953, in this diocese as Deacon-in-Charge and later rector of St. Michael's Church, Bon Air, during which time he also served as chaplain to St. Christopher's School, Richmond, and was recognized as Chesterfield County's Young Man of the Year.

In 1957, Charles Vaché was called to be rector of Trinity Church, Portsmouth, where he served both the parish and the city with great distinction. He wrote a history of Portsmouth Parish and opened his home, hearth, and cupboards to mostly military men who became known as the Rectory Rogues.

Charles Vaché offered exemplary leadership to the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Virginia as a member of the Executive Board, chairman of the

Department of College Work, member and president of the Standing Committee, member and chairman of the Board of Examining Chaplains, chairman of the Commission on Ministry, frequent deputy to General Convention, and original board member of Westminster-Canterbury of Hampton Roads, of whose foundation he was later elected trustee.

Charles Vaché was elected and consecrated bishop coadjutor of the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Virginia in 1976 and became its diocesan bishop in 1978. He was known for his pastoral availability, sound learning and fair judgment and for his willingness ? shaped through persevering prayer ? to change his views on difficult issues such as the ordination of women.

Bishop Vaché served the Episcopal Church as member and chairman of the Church Deployment Office Board, member of the Standing Committee on Ecumenical Relations, and the Committee on Pastoral Development, and member and chairman of the North American Regional Committee of St. George's College, Jerusalem.

Bishop Vaché was honored as a Fellow of the College of Preachers and as a Doctor of Divinity by Seabury-Western Theological Seminary, Virginia Theological Seminary, and St. Paul's College.

After his retirement as diocesan bishop in 1991, Bishop Vaché spent fifteen months in Jerusalem as a Volunteer for Mission, serving as chaplain at St. George's College, and later served nine months as acting dean of St. George's Cathedral, subsequently bearing public criticism for his advocacy for the Palestinian people.

After a brief retirement, Bishop Vaché accepted a call to serve as assisting bishop in the Diocese of East Carolina from 1993 to 1996 where he developed guidelines and procedures and training for the prevention of sexual

misconduct.

Bishop Vaché served as Interim rector of Bruton Parish Church, Williamsburg, from 1996 to 1999 bringing his wisdom, experience, and healing gifts to that parish.

Charles Vaché accepted a call to serve as assisting bishop in the Diocese of West Virginia from 2000 to 2001 during a difficult time in its history, and he served as the interim rector of the Church of the Good Shepherd, Norfolk, from 2003 to 2004.

Bishop Vaché was a man of deep faith and prayer, broad learning and diligent labor, gentleness in strength, compassion and humility, and playful spirit. He was, a faithful pastor, wise mentor, learned teacher, gracious colleague, servant leader, and loyal friend.

Bishop Vaché is survived by his sister, Edith "Che" Spurlin, his nieces and nephews, Bridget, Peter, Andrew, Lynn, Michael, Sherry, and Laurie, and his faithful foster son, Val de France.

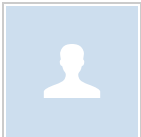

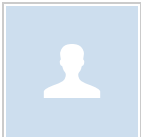

He secured sufficient funding to support my education for a period of four years, 1979-1982. Bishop Vache arranged for me to Live at Caterbury House at O.D.U and during the summer I worked as a gardener in Diocesan center at Talbot Hall. Bishop Vache was a man of peace. He supported Israel’s right to exist and advocated for the rights of the Palestinians. I remember the vilification he received in the local newspapers for his witness to the suffering of the Palestinians. Bishop Vache’s contribution to Saint George’s Cathedral and Saint George’s College are always remembered by the local Palestinian community. Jerusalem will miss Bishop Vache. I will miss him too.*
