Oliver “Buddy” Milton Smith, Jr., 49, born in Portsmouth, VA, went home to be with the Lord on June 26, 2020. Resident of Deep Creek, Oliver worked as the Director of the Nuclear Regional Maintenance Department at Norfolk Naval Shipyard. He was a veteran of the United States Army and an active member of the community as a beloved softball coach. He was an avid hunter and fisherman, who loved spending time on the beach and with his family. He had an immense amount of pride for his children and will be greatly missed.

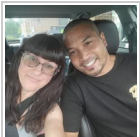

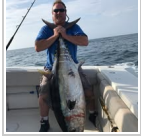
