Clyde E. Casteen, 78, went to be with the Lord on Tuesday Jan. 26, 2010. He was a native of Norfolk County, he started his 41 years in law enforcement in Norfolk County and Chesapeake Police Dept. and retired as an Investigator and area supervisor for the VA State Cooperation Commission. He was recognized as the First Chesapeake Policeman of the year in 1964, a charter and life member of the Chesapeake Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #9, where he served as its former President and in many other capacities. He was a charter member of the Wallace-ton Ruritan Club. Clyde was a Coast Guard Veteran of Korea.

Mr. Casteen is survived by his wife, Georgia C. Casteen; a daughter, Tami Martin and her husband, Art; a son, Mike Casteen and his wife, Cindy; 6 grandchildren, Phillip, Heather, Todd, Alana, Scott and Megan; 11 great-grandchildren; a sister, Bessie Deal; numerous nieces, nephews and other devoted family members. 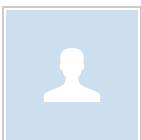
