My name is John Elwood Owens and I grew up in Shea Terrace and my father ran the Sixth Avenue Barber Shop for many years. I attended WWHS with Kenny. I now live in Florence, South Carolina. Kenny and I played Little League Baseball together at Buck Childs' Field behind Harry Hunt Jr. High School on the "Bootsie's Food Market" team, around 1956-1958. I remember he was a very good athlete and one of our best ball players. Our team members also included Richard Vincent, Richard Ryles, John Dillon, Dickie Esleeck, and others. After the games, we often went as a team in our uniforms up to Bootsie's Food Market on Sixth Avenue and got free ice cream paid for by John Dillon's uncle who came and watched most of the games.
