Kurt A. Lehnert age 85, passed away on July 16, 2008 at Sentara Norfolk General Hospital surrounded by his loving family. Kurt was born on September 27, 1922, in Unterlauter, Germany, the son of the late Alfred Lehnert and Meta Probst Lehnert.
