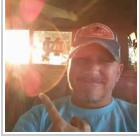

“ *When my family moved from Ridge Road to Highland Park on Chincoteague Island, Virginia in 1979, when I was 11 years old, I became quick friends with Melissa Jester, Rodney Merritt, Laura Jones and others in the neighborhood--such a great place to grow up. Rarely a day went by that we were not all hanging out together, playing games, riding bikes and then mopeds, staying out late in the Summer until our parents called us home. Year after year, as we were growing up together and going to school together, there was a bond of friendship that could not be broken.*

Even into adulthood, that bond was still unbroken, and Melissa was one of those people who intentionally kept those bonds of friendship strong. I don't believe she ever met a stranger.
