Myrtle Marie Hayes-Welch Beachum was born in Burnsville, North Carolina, and raised in Wadesboro, North Carolina, on the Smith Family Farm. She is preceded in death by her husband of 67 years, M. Herman Beachum. Her younger siblings, Peggy Beck, Henry Welch Jr., Kay Perry, and Ted H. Welch, survived her. Her only child is daughter Harriet Beachum Sadler. On July 20, 1996, Myrtle gained son-in-law George Sadler along with 8 more grandchildren, Tammy, Angie, George Jr., Annalisa, Cathy, Daniel, Laura, & Lindsay. They eventually gave her 13 more great-grandchildren and 10 great-great-grandchildren whom Myrtle fully embraced as her own. Myrtle passed peacefully of old age at home, surrounded by family, on Thursday, May 23rd, 2024, just five months shy of her 97th birthday.

Myrtle was born shortly before the great depression, and this undoubtedly gave her the tenacity, strength, and determination that everyone who knew her would describe. She was married to her husband, Martin H. Beachum, known as Herman, on July 15th, 1947, shortly after he returned from service in WWII. They shared 67 wonderful years together. Together, they were an unstoppable force and achieved the life they always dreamed of, filled with

family and travels. They had only one child, daughter Harriet, 2 grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren, whom they were blessed to have while they still had full health. They were able to have a hand in raising those children as well. Myrtle loved all her family immeasurably and remained close to every member her entire life. She made many sacrifices throughout her life to be able to be there for all her family members when they needed a shoulder or a hand. She took great care to be there and create special memories with each of her family members, whether they were immediate family, extended family, stepfamily, or in-laws.

You would never catch Myrtle without being put together and wearing lipstick, even if she was cutting her grass. She was an accomplished and avid gardener winning yard of the month for her beautiful pink azalea bushes so many times she was featured in the Virginian Pilot with a full page spread. Her love of gardening was a lifelong affair; she would climb a ladder to clean her gutters and cut her own grass well into her 90s. In fact, after she recovered from her stroke and was wheelchair-bound, she would still go into her yard pulling weeds. She was also a skilled seamstress, making many things, from dresses to quilts, curtains, and even rugs. She truly mastered every task she set her mind to, so much so that she could turn actual trash into beautiful treasures that others would envy. Myrtle was able to pass her skills on to 4 different generations and left a lasting impression on all those whose lives she touched.
