



Richard Dickie Be-Bop Harrell Sr.

Richard C. “ Dickie Be-Bop” Harrell, Sr. passed away May 31, 2023 at the age of 82. Dickie was the only child of Mary Bernadette and Richard Henry Harrell, and he was a native of Portsmouth. His father passed away when Dickie was 4 years old. Dickie attended St. Paul's Catholic School. He taught himself to play the drums on his mother's pots and pans. He worked at a local radio station before school and at the age of 15 he had the opportunity to play drums with local talent Gene Vincent. Soon Gene's backing band The Blue Caps was formed. From age 15-17 Dickie recorded and toured with Gene Vincent and the Blue Caps. He performed with them in the movie “The Girl Can’t Help It” in 1956. After leaving the band, Dickie played in numerous local Tidewater bands and later toured with the band during several of the Blue Caps reunions in the US and Europe. He retired from the Naval Station, Norfolk, VA after 37 years of service. The Blue Caps were inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland, OH, April 14, 2012. They were also inducted into the Rockabilly Hall of Fame located in Nashville, TN.

Dickie is survived by his wife of 28 years and best friend of 38 years, Donna. He is also survived by his mother-in-law Jean Bristow; niece Stephanie Bristow; sister-in-law Cindy Myers; son Richard Harrell Jr., and two grandsons. He was predeceased by his son Timothy Harrell.

Dickie also leaves behind countless friends - personal, music related, and

online. He was always supportive of local artists. He will be dearly missed. Hope he is jamming with all his friends and musicians we have lost over the years. Rock on Dickie.

A memorial service will be held at 11 am Thursday, June 15, 2023, at Loving Funeral Home with visitation one hour prior to the service. The family suggests memorial contributions to the Portsmouth Humane Society in memory of Dickie.
