The middle son Elmer (former USAF LT CMDR) assisted with lowering the US flag at half mast at home. Some of Silver’s life included but not limited to: Decorated service of 27 years USCG, during the Vietnam and Cold War Eras. Several achievements including US Coast Guardman of the Year – 1975. NY/NJ.
