Will Hapeman, aged 70, died unexpectedly on Friday May 1, 2026, in Chesapeake Virginia. He was a devoted grandfather, animal lover, and friend. Will was a gifted musician and his singing and guitar playing could often be heard through his home and will be deeply missed. He loved gardening to support local wildlife and planted a monarch way station to support monarch migration. His

community of dog loving friends at the Western Branch Dog Park were an integral part of recent years, and Will could be found there with his three dogs every weekday morning it wasn't raining. He spent his final years pursuing his passions and caring for his family. A devoted lifelong learner, endlessly curious, and the emotional rock of his family, he will be remembered for his wisdom, guidance, humor, and compassion.

Will was a beloved husband and father, a beautiful human being, and a light in the lives of all those he met. His grandchildren will forever remember his teaching them how to fish, use a bow an arrow, canoe, and make tacos.
